Your Directors have pleasure in presenting the 8th Boards' Report of Adventures Beyond Barriers Foundation together with audited Statement of Accounts and the Auditors' Report of your Foundation for the financial year ended 31stMarch, 2022.

Adventures Beyond Barriers Foundation was incorporated on 13thOctober 2014 and registered as a non-profit making company under Section8 of the Companies Act, 2013. The Main object of Adventures Beyond Barriers Foundation is to raise awareness and to enlist the public's aid for the need of physically handicapped people to help injured Handicapped men and women and assist each other; and to provide unique, direct programs and services to meet their need thru recreational, adventures, health rejuvenating activities, like paragliding, paracelling, trekking, parachoot landing and sport related activities for physically and mentally challenged section of society at large and is started as a program to provide comfort items to physically handicapped people has grown into a complete rehabilitative effort to assist them as they recover and transition back to civilian life, & to promote enhance, adventures,sports activities for physically challenged people in India and abroad

2. EXTRACT OF ANNUAL RETURN

The Company does not have Website, Hence the Annual Return is not required to be uploaded.

3. OPERATING RESULTS

The company has earned income of Rs. 21,03,174.12 during the financial year. The Company is positive about its future growth and expansion of the Company.

The beginning of 2021, we set up Vaccination drive for 3000 Persons with Disability (PwD's) and their care givers in Mumbai. Doing all the activities, right from registration of PwDs on the Cowin App, to providing them with transportation to the centre and back, providing them with an ally to help during the vaccination and paying for the vaccination for PwDs and their care giver.

Along with this we continued our Ration Distribution and increased our reach across Maharashtra. We supported 3500+ families of PwDs. ABBF partnered with RayRise Design Lab, Bangalore to provide bionics for special needs children from underprivileged and low income background. The scope of bionics span from prosthetics and orthotics for the legs, hand, spine and head. Through this collaboration, 16 children with disability have been rehabilitated in the state of Karnataka.

ABBF also finished the 1st Phase of development of their Accessible Sports and Development Centre, Dhanep. It conducted its 1st camping and trekking activity for 2 days with Kaveri Gifted Education and Research Center.

4. RESERVES

The Board of Directors of your company has transferred amount of Rs. 21,03,174.12 to Profit & Loss Surplus Account during the year 2021-22.

5. DEPOSITS

The Foundation has not accepted deposit from the public falling within the ambit of Section 73 of the Companies Act, 2013 and The Companies (Acceptance of Deposits) Rules, 2014.

6. CONSERVATION OF ENERGY, TECHNOLOGY ABSORPTION, FOREIGN EXCHANGE EARNINGS AND OUTGO

The information on conservation of energy, technology absorption and foreign exchange earnings and outgo stipulated under Section 134(3)(m) of the Companies Act, 2013 read with Rule, 8 of The Companies (Accounts) Rules, 2014 are not application to the Foundation.

7. ORDER PASSED BY THE COURT OR TRIBUNAL OR REGULATORS

There is no order passed or injunction imposed by any court, tribunal or regulators for or against the Foundation impacting the going concern status or Foundation's future operations.

8. INTERNAL CONTROL SYSTEMS AND THEIR ADEQUACY

The Foundation has an Internal Control System, commensurate with the size, scale and complexity of its operations. The Internal Control Department monitors and evaluates the efficacy and adequacy of internal control system in the Foundation, its compliance with operating systems, accounting procedures and policies at all locations of the Foundation. Based on the report of the department, corrective action was taken by the board in the respective areas, thereby strengthening the overall controls.

9. MEETINGS DURING THE FINANCIAL YEAR

BOARD MEETINGS

During the financial year 2021-22, the Board of Directors of the Foundation duly meet Four times. The intervening gap between the two meetings was within the period as prescribed under the Companies Act, 2013.

10. DIRECTORS AND INDEPENDENT DIRECTOR

The Board of Directors of the Foundation is duly constituted and the Foundation has not received any resignations from the Directors of the Foundation. The provisions of section 152 (6) of the Companies Act, 2013 are not applicable to the Foundation.

11. KEY MANAGERIAL PERSONNEL

The Company has not appointed or received resignation of any person as a Key Managerial Personnel of the company during the financial year, as the provisions of section 203 of the Companies Act, 2013 and The Companies (Appointment and Remuneration of Managerial Personnel) Rules, 2014 are not applicable to the company.

12. DIRECTORS' RESPONSIBILITY STATEMENT

Pursuant to the provisions of Section 134(3)(c) of Companies Act, 2013, the Board of Directors hereby confirms,

The Foundation has not given loan or provided security/guarantee to any person or any other body corporate or made investment in any body corporate in excess of limits specified in section 186(2) of Companies Act, 2013 during the year.

18. SECRETARIAL AUDIT

The Secretarial Audit under section 204 of Companies Act, 2013 and The Companies (Appointment and Remuneration of Managerial Personnel) Rules, 2014 are not applicable to the Foundation during the financial year.

19. ANNUAL RETURN CERTIFICATION

The Annual Return Certification in Form MGT-8 under section 92 (2) of the Companies Act, 2013 and Rule 11 (2) of Companies (Management and Administration) Rules, 2014 are not applicable to the Foundation during the financial year.

20. STATUTORY AUDITORS & COMMENTS

The term of office of Auditor of the company M/s. R. M. Khustale & Co., Chartered Accountants (Firm Registration No. 135530W) is expiring in this 8th Annual General Meeting of the Company. Therefore, he is eligible for appointment as auditor of the Company at this ensuing Annual General Meeting. He has confirmed his eligibility under Section 141 of the Companies Act, 2013 and the Rules framed thereunder for the appointment as Statutory Auditors of the Company. The Directors of the Company recommend appointing of M/s. R. M. Khustale & Co., Chartered Accountants (Firm Registration No. 135530W) as Statutory Auditors of the Company from the conclusion of the 8th Annual General Meeting till the conclusion of the 13th Annual General Meeting.

The Auditors' comments are self-explanatory, and therefore, in the opinion of the Board of Directors, do not call for any further explanation.

21. COST AUDITORS

The maintenance of Cost Record and its Audit under section 148 of Companies Act, 2013 and read with The Companies (Cost Records and Audit) Amendment Rules, 2014, is not applicable to the Foundation.
